Professional Experience:

Environmental management experience was obtained at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, during the period May 1992 to September 2000. Mr. Etsitty rose from the position of Environmental Protection Specialist in U.S. EPA Region 9 (San Francisco, CA) to National Program Manager in the Office of Solid Waste (Washington, DC). All of his time at U.S. EPA was focused on creating new programs, policies and methods for tribal governments to assume more regulatory authority to manage their own environmental programs. He helped develop and implement the Indian Environmental General Assistance Program and the Municipal Solid Waste and Hazardous Waste Grant Programs for Indian Country.

Mr. Etsitty was appointed to the position of Executive Director for the Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency (NNEPA), on July 21, 2003, and confirmed October 22, 2004. Currently, Mr. Etsitty manages and directs four departments in NNEPA: Air and Toxics; Waste Regulatory Compliance; Surface and Ground Water Protection, and Criminal Enforcement. NNEPA's FY 2005 budget is approximately \$7 million dollars which supports 66 employees across 17 programs.
