## **David R. Case**

David Case is the Executive Director of the Environmental Technology Council (ETC), a Washington DC-based trade association that represents the commercial hazardous waste industry. The ETC member companies provide services and technologies to their customers for recycling and reuse, materials reuse and energy recovery, chemical treatment, high-temperature incineration and secure landfill disposal of industrial and hazardous wastes.

Mr. Case represents the ETC on Federal policy and regulatory issues before Congress and the U.S. EPA, including RCRA implementation and reforms. He has also been the lead attorney for the ETC in many cases involving the RCRA law and regulations.

Mr. Case is the contributing author of “The Resource Conservation and Recovery Act” in the Environmental Law Handbook published by Government Institutes. He is also a lecturer and author of other books and articles on environmental law and policy. He is a member of the American Bar Association’s Section on Environment, Energy, and Resources, and a former Chairman of the Environmental Committee of the Federal Bar Association. He is currently a Member of the Editorial Advisory Board for the Environmental Law Reporter.

Mr. Case received his J.D. from the University of Michigan School of Law, his LL.M. from Cambridge University, England, and his B.A. from Amherst College. He is admitted to the Bars of the District of Columbia, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit, and the U.S. Supreme Court.
