Ed Hopkins is Director of the Sierra Club's Environmental Quality program, which is responsible for research, public education and legislative and administrative lobbying on a wide range of air and water quality and toxics issues.

Hopkins has worked with the Sierra Club for 13 years. During that time, he has led the Club's efforts on public education campaigns on factory farm pollution, Superfund toxic waste site cleanup, and clean air and mercury pollution.

Hopkins has 30 years' experience working with environmental advocacy groups at the state and federal level on pollution issues. He has testified numerous times before Congressional committees and administrative agencies on clean water, drinking water and groundwater protection, appropriations, brownfields remediation, toxic chemical policy and other issues. He has also appeared on national media outlets concerning a range of pollution issues.

In addition to non-profit environmental advocacy, he served for four years as policy advisor on environmental issues for former Ohio Governor Richard Celeste.

He also worked for two years as a consultant for the Pew Charitable Trusts, one of the nation's largest environmental grantmakers, where he helped launch state-level campaigns to win the right to know about pesticide use and developed lay-of-the land research for grantmaking decisions.
