

Based in Albuquerque, N.M., the ASRT represents more than 146,000 medical imaging technologists and radiation therapists nationwide. It is the largest radiologic science association in the world.

As chief executive officer, Dr. Sal Martino is responsible for overseeing the ASRT's mission to advance the profession of radiologic technology in order to improve patient care. The ASRT achieves this mission by producing educational conferences, scholarly journals and educational materials for radiologic technologists; developing practice standards and scopes of practice for the profession; developing educational curricula for the radiologic sciences; and advocating for the establishment of educational and certification standards for radiologic technologists.

The ASRT is a steadfast proponent of measures to improve the safety and quality of medical imaging examinations and radiation therapy procedures.

Dr. Martino has been employed by the ASRT since September 1999. He previously served as the association's executive vice president and chief academic officer (2001 to 2009) and as its director of education and research (1999 to 2001).

In addition, Dr. Martino has served as the chief executive officer of the ASRT Education and Research Foundation since 2009. The Foundation awards grants to individuals conducting academic or clinical research in the radiologic sciences and also awards scholarships to entry-level students and practicing professionals who are pursuing education in the field.
