

Staff Report on the Workload of the Federal Communications Commission

The Workload of the Federal Communications Commission

In response to questions from Chairman Walden of the Communications and Technology Subcommittee and Chairman Stearns of the Oversight and Investigations Subcommittee, the Federal Communications Commission has provided the Energy and Commerce Committee with a significant amount of data regarding its workload, including the number of complaints, petitions, applications, and other items pending at the Commission, its work meeting internal deadlines as well as deadlines established by statute, and its work reviewing the transactions under the Communications Act. That data is attached.

In sum, the data demonstrate that there have been substantial improvements in the handling of the Commission's workload since Chairman Genachowski joined the Commission. Nevertheless, the Commission still faces significant challenges in its work, including a significant backlog of unanswered petitions and unheard consumer complaints. And there are currently no statutory assurances that future chairmen will remain faithful to what progress Chairman Genachowski has made. This staff summary highlights some of the data regarding the FCC's current workflow.

Proceedings, Petitions, and Complaints

As of July 5, the Commission had pending before it 3,472 open proceedings, 26,335 petitions and requests, and 1,385 petitions for reconsideration. Also pending at the Commission were 1,531,893 unaddressed consumer complaints and 33,233 license applications and renewals. Breaking down these numbers may give a fuller picture of the Commission's work.

Proceedings. Of the Commission's 3,472 open proceedings, 3,213 or 93 percent have lain dormant—without any external filings made in the docket—for more than two years. But the Commission has recently taken action to clear out this underbrush. This past year, the Commission created streamlined procedures for the closing of dormant proceedings, and on November 1, the Commission closed 999 dockets, about one third of the total.

Petitions. Twenty percent, or 5,328, of the 26,335 petitions and requests pending at the Commission have been there for more than two years and, of those, 3,122 have been pending for more than five years. Of the more than 5,000 petitions and requests that have been pending for more than two years, 3,126 petitions and requests or 59 percent are assigned to the Media Bureau, 940 to the Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau, and 746 to the Wireline Competition Bureau.

Perhaps more problematic is the Commission's backlog of 1,385 petitions for reconsideration and applications for review, which by definition ask the FCC to reconsider a decision it or one of the bureaus has already made. 852 of the pending petitions, or 62 percent, have been pending for more than two years, and of these 476 petitions for reconsideration have languished at the Commission for more than five years.

Contrast these facts to the Commission's work on petitions for reconsideration that are subject to a 90-day deadline under section 405 of the Communications Act. During Chairman Genachowski's tenure, the Commission has resolved 1,125 petitions for reconsideration subject to this deadline—it resolved 66 percent of them, or 744, within the deadline. Setting aside the

169 resolved petitions that the Commission identified as already overdue when Chairman Genachowski took office, the Commission's record is stronger: It complied with the 90-day deadline 78 percent of the time.

Complaints. Of the million and a half consumer complaints pending at the Commission, almost 90 percent have been pending for more than two years. Almost all of those two-years-or-older complaints address broadcast indecency, which is currently before the courts. It is unclear from the data provided by the agency how many of the pending indecency complaints fall under the fleeting-expletives policy, the subject of the litigation. It is clear, however, that the Commission has continued to address indecency complaints falling outside of the scope of the appeals, such as complaints concerning cable services and complaints about materials falling within the nightly safe harbor.

Outside of the indecency context, there is virtually no backlog of consumer complaints. Of the 334 complaints it had pending regarding "slamming"—the practice of changing a consumer's carrier without authorization—none had been pending for more than two years. And of the 3,414 junk fax complaints pending, only 20 had been pending for more than two years. Notably, the Junk Fax Prevention Act of 2005 requires the Commission to report on its work resolving junk fax complaints on an annual basis.

Licenses. During Chairman Genachowski's tenure, the Commission has reduced the backlog of satellite license applications by 89 percent and the backlog of television broadcasting licenses by 30 percent. Nevertheless, 13 percent of the 33,233 license applications and renewals pending at the Commission, or 4,185, have been pending for more than two years, with 2,246 of these more than five years old. Many of these pending license applications are assigned to the Media Bureau, which may suggest that many licenses have not been renewed because associated consumer complaints regarding indecent programming remain pending.

Deadlines for Action

Internal Deadlines. By the Commission's count, it has established 38 separate internal deadlines for action, with deadlines as short as 7 days and as long as five years. Under Chairman Genachowski, it has met these deadlines 71 percent of the time.

One notable success of the Commission's deadlines has been its work on streamlined transactions and Wireless Radio Service license transfers. The Commission approved 18,062 transactions, or 84 percent of all transactions reviewed since June 3, 2008, under the streamlining procedures it adopted in 2003. Similarly, the Commission met its deadline in evaluating all 1,392 Wireless Radio Service that qualified.

Another area of improvement has been the Commission's work in reviewing non-streamlined transactions within its own 180-day deadline. Some have complained that the Commission stops or resets the clock to accommodate bankruptcy proceedings, actions by other agencies, modifications in applications, and other exigent circumstances. Nevertheless, the Commission has shown some progress under Chairman Genachowski, having resolved 90 out of 118 non-streamlined transactions within its own deadline. That 76-percent success rate is an increase from the 52-percent success rate of the recent past.

Statutory Deadlines. Congress has established numerous deadlines for action, some applying to all agencies and others applying to the Commission alone. The Commission’s processing of Freedom of Information Act Requests, for example, is subject to a 20-day deadline by statute, and the Commission has met that deadline in 83 percent, or 988, of the 1,211 requests it has received under Chairman Genachowski.

The Commission has also had some success in meeting the deadlines of the Communications Act. For example, the Commission has taken timely action on 97 percent of the 650 Telecommunications Relay Service informal complaints it has received. In contrast, the Commission has more often than not met the 90-day deadline to act on certain petitions for reconsideration, but that estimate does not appear to account for the 630 petitions for reconsideration that have already missed the statutory deadline still pending.

But in other areas—especially reports to Congress—the Commission has repeatedly missed its deadlines. For example, the Commission released its second annual Satellite Competition Report in 2008, but is still working on a report to cover calendar years 2008, 2009, and 2010. Similarly, the Act requires the Commission to produce each year a Status of Competition in the Market for the Delivery of Video Programming Report. In 2009, the Commission released a Notice of Inquiry to seek more information for that report, and asked more questions again in the spring of 2011. The Commission claims that it will soon be delivering a report on video competition from 2007 through 2010. Although the Commission suggests that none of these reports are late because the statute “does not include a date when the reports are due,” it is hard to see how a report delivered every three to four years is “annual.”

Other Reported Data

The Commission has also provided information about its work on Commission-level transactions, as well as its rulemaking process. On transactions, for example, the Commission revealed that applicants in several transactions did not offer “voluntary commitments” to the Commission until a few weeks, or even a few days, before the Commission approved the transaction. The Commission declined, however, to list the conditions and voluntary commitments associated with each Commission-level transaction and declined to specify the specific provisions of the Communications Act that gave the Commission authority to impose each condition or commitment, instead pointing to the Commission’s general authority to review transactions and ensure the veracity of statements placed into the record of a transaction.

More encouraging is the Commission work on rulemakings. Under Chairman Genachowski, the average time between the adoption and release of an item has been 2.2 days; the average time between the adoption of an item and its publication in the Federal Register has been 37.3 days. Note that these calculations do not include recent outliers like the network neutrality order or the Universal Service Fund reform order, whose Federal Register publication and adoption occurred after the Commission reported these data.

The Commission has also improved its facilitation of public participation in the Commission’s notice-and-comment rulemakings. According to the Commission, 85 percent of Notices of Proposed Rulemaking now contain the text of proposed rules and 84 percent of Notices of Proposed Rulemaking provide a full 30 days for public comment. In contrast, Notices of

Proposed Rulemaking in the recent past have only included the specific language of proposed rules about 38 percent of the time.

Conclusion

The Commission is charged with regulating the very industries that have the potential to create jobs, innovate, and help rebuild our economy. More than ever, the public deserves government agencies to be transparent and responsive. Chairman Genachowski has made significant improvements to the agency's processes during his tenure, but in many areas the Commission still has a long way to go. Hopefully, the next report from the Commission regarding these matters—expected in January, six months after the first—will show continued improvement.

In the meantime, Congress can move forward to ensure that the positive steps taken by Chairman Genachowski remain no matter who the next chairman is. The Communications and Technology Subcommittee is currently examining two bills—the Federal Communications Commission Process Reform Act and the Federal Communications Commission Consolidated Reporting Act—that would put many of these good government practices into law, while still allowing flexibility for the agency to conduct the public's business.

For example, the Process Reform Act would require the Commission to establish deadlines for acting on the various proceedings before it and report on its work to meet those deadlines. Doing so should reduce backlogs at the Commission—like the 5,328 petitions and requests pending at the Commission for more than two years and the 3,122 pending for more than five years—and provide a timeframe so that parties awaiting a response knows when the Commission is likely to act. The Act bolsters these deadlines with regular reporting—a strategy employed by the Junk Fax Prevention Act of 2005, which has kept backlogged junk fax complaints to a minimum (less than one percent of junk fax complaints were pending for more than two years).

The Process Reform Act would also require the Commission to publish orders within seven days of adoption, set comment periods at a minimum of 30 days, and include the specific language of proposed rules in Notices of Proposed Rulemaking, building on some of the recent improvements in the Commission's processes.

To help the Commission complete its work with existing resources, the Consolidated Reporting Act would consolidate eight separate reports of the Commission into one, eliminating duplication of effort while ensuring more meaningful reporting. The Consolidated Reporting Act would further put these reports on a two-year cycle linked to the Congressional calendar to further reduce the reporting burden. These consolidations should free up the resources so that the Commission can actually complete some of the reports—like the Satellite Competition Report and the Status of Competition in the Market for the Delivery of Video Programming Report—that it has not completed for years.

The American people and the communications and technology sector want our federal agencies to be open and responsive, and in all these ways and more, the Process Reform Act and the Consolidated Reporting Act are modest first steps towards that goal. Bringing additional transparency and accountability to the Commission is not a partisan issue—it's just good government.



Question Four:

Question Five:

How many dockets are currently open at the Commission? How many of these dockets have pending items in them that the Commission has not yet addressed? How many dockets have been inactive for more than six months? Two years? Five years?

Response:

There are 3,472 dockets currently open at the Commission. With regards to whether or not a docket has been “inactive,” we can state whether there have been any external filings made in the docket. Of the open dockets, 3,278 have not had any filings for more than six months; 3,213 have not had any filings for more than two years; and 3,077 have not had any filings for more than five years.

Historically, docket numbers were assigned to proceedings such as notice and comment rulemaking proceedings and certain adjudicatory proceedings that were expected to attract a large number of commenters. When no further action in a docketed proceeding is required or contemplated, that proceeding may be terminated. Termination closes the docket to any new filings. A terminated docket remains part of the Commission’s official records, however and its content (pleadings, orders, etc.) continues to be accessible to the public.

Over the past 18 months the Commission has been actively working to terminate dormant proceedings as well as to increase the efficiency of other administrative procedures related to docketing and electronic filing.

With a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking¹ released on February 22, 2010, the Commission advanced its effort to streamline and improve the docket management process as well as to maximize electronic filing through the commission's improved Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS). The Commission issued the corresponding Report and Order on Procedures² that amended Commission rules on February 4, 2011. Among other things, the Report and Order on Procedures increased the efficiency of the Commission's docket management and enhanced public participation by broadening the use of docketed proceedings; expanded the requirement for electronic filing and reduced the scope of the obligation to file paper copies; permitted staff in certain circumstances to notify parties electronically of docket filings; and streamlined the process for closing inactive dockets.

The Report and Order on Procedures delegated the authority to the Chief of the Consumer & Governmental Affairs Bureau (CGB) to periodically review all open dockets and, in consultation with the responsible Bureaus or Offices, to identify those dockets that appear to be candidates for termination. The Commission stated that these proceedings may include dockets in which no further action is required or contemplated, as well as those in which no pleadings or other documents have been filed for several years. It also specified that proceedings in which petitions addressing the merits are pending should not be terminated, absent the parties' consent.

CGB, in consultation with all of the Commission's Bureaus and Offices, has identified 1,000 dockets for possible termination, considering those open proceedings in which no action has been taken or pleading filed since December 31, 2004. Prior to terminating these proceedings, CGB issued a Public Notice³ on June 3, 2011 to afford any interested parties an opportunity to comment about whether a particular proceeding should or should not be terminated. The comment and reply period on the public notice is 45 days, giving the public ample time for comment and reply. At the end of the comment period, CGB, in consultation with the responsible Bureaus or Offices, will consider those submissions and make a determination of which dockets to terminate.

Question Six:

We are interested in tracking the Commission's progress on resolving its backlog. Please update the Committee with the information requested in questions 1 through 5 every six months for the remainder of your chairmanship.

Question Seven:

You mentioned that you generally support shot clocks, and that the FCC employs a variety of shot clocks to keep track of its own performance in resolving petitions before it. One well known example is the 180-day shot clock for merger review. *See* 47 C.F.R. § 63.03(c)(2). We are interested in the shot clocks the FCC has established for itself, and how well the FCC has done in meeting those shot clocks. Please list all shot clocks codified in the FCC's rules. For each shot clock, please include:

- (a) the citation in your rules,
- (b) the type of item qualifying for the shot clock,
- (c) the length of the shot clock,
- (d) when the shot clock begins (e.g., upon filing),
- (e) the number of items resolved since July 1, 2009, within the shot-clock period, and

Question Nine:

We are interested in better understanding the FCC's transaction review process. How many transaction applications have been filed at the Commission in the last three years? How many of these filings were approved using the Commission's streamlined procedures? Please list each non-streamlined merger, transfer-of-control, and transfer-of-license application filed in the last three years. For each listed application, please include:

- (a) the date the application was filed,
- (b) the date the Commission set the application out for public comment,
- (c) the date the comment cycle closed for the application,
- (d) any periods during which the Commission stopped the 180-day shot clock, and
- (e) the date the Commission approved or rejected the application.

Response:

A total of 21,398 transaction applications have been filed with the Commission since June 3, 2008. We define a “transaction” as a request for approval to transfer control of a license or authorization, or a request to assign a license or authorization to another party. Within some bureaus, a single license transfer is recorded as a transaction, even if multiple licenses are involved in the same matter (for example, acquisition of a company owning several radio stations). Within other bureaus, a single request to transfer multiple licenses is recorded as a single transaction.

The figure provided reflects the number of transactions as they are recorded by the relevant bureaus. There may also be instances in which one transaction involves licenses or authorizations that are within the purview of multiple bureaus, and the figure above reflects the separate transactions recorded by different bureaus.

Of those 21,398 transactions, approximately 18,062, or 84.4%, were approved using the Commission’s streamlined procedures. The remaining 15.6% include applications that were withdrawn, are still pending, were denied, were dismissed, were returned for correction or further information, or were not eligible for streamlined treatment. For purposes of this response, we define “streamlined procedures” for transactions involving section 214 authorization to be those described in rule 63.03 for domestic authorizations, and rule 63.12 for international authorizations. 47 C.F.R. §§ 63.03, 63.12.

For transactions involving Title III authorizations – licenses to use spectrum – the Commission does not have a distinct set of rules called “streamlining,” but the vast majority of applications are resolved without the Commission or a Bureau preparing an order. We consider those transactions resolved without an order – such as those resolved by default or by Public Notice – to be streamlined.

With regard to non-streamlined applications, you asked about the Commission’s shot clock. The 180-day informal timeline, or shot clock, introduced 11 years ago, is a tool to increase transparency and predictability in review of transactions. It is not a hard deadline or requirement, but rather reflects the Commission’s efforts to complete most transaction reviews within this time period. The timeline is described as “informal” to indicate its flexibility to take account of special circumstances, such as bankruptcy proceedings; required actions by other agencies; modifications in the initial application; or particularly complex or controversial issues, which may require a longer review period. *See* Informal Timeline for Consideration of Applications for Transfers or Assignments of Licenses or Authorizations Relating to Complex Mergers, *available at* <http://transition.fcc.gov/transaction/timeline.html>.

Since June 3, 2008, the Commission has handled 174 transactions on a non-streamlined basis. Here, we count as a single transaction any matter that was resolved by a bureau or by multiple bureaus working together even if multiple licenses or authorizations were involved, when the transaction resulted in or is likely to result in an order. In addition, we include all common

carrier transactions that were handled outside of the streamlined procedures described in rule 63.03 for domestic authorizations and rule 63.12 for international authorizations. 47 C.F.R. §§ 63.03, 63.12. Of those, 119, or 68%, were resolved in 180 days or fewer or are still pending within that timeframe.

Since I became Chairman, the Commission has begun proceedings on 118 non-streamlined transactions. Of those, 90, or 76%, have been resolved in 180 days or fewer or are still pending within that timeframe. Please see the attached spreadsheet at Attachment Q9 for the information you requested.

The Commission's authority to review transactions is contained in sections 214(a) and 310(d) of the Communications Act and Section 2 of the Cable Landing License Act. 47 U.S.C. §§ 35, 214(a), 310(d). Under these provisions, we must determine whether approval of a proposed

transaction would serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity. Conditions, which are expressly contemplated in the statute, *see id.* § 214(c) (providing the Commission authority to impose “such terms and conditions as in its judgment the public convenience and necessity may require”), § 303(r) (providing authority to “prescribe such restrictions and conditions, not inconsistent with law, as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act”), can be an essential part this review, insofar as they allow the Commission to determine that promised public interest benefits actually will occur, or that potential harms from the transaction will be avoided. Indeed, conditions can permit the Commission to approve a transaction that otherwise would not be in the public interest, even with remedies that are within the purview of other agencies to impose.

Parties often make voluntary commitments to the Commission in the course of a transaction proceeding, and the Commission can condition the approval of the transaction on compliance with those commitments. In any transaction proceeding before the Commission, all parties must ensure that they do not, “[i]n any written or oral statement of fact, intentionally provide material factual information that is incorrect or intentionally omit material information that is necessary to prevent any material factual statement that is made from being incorrect or misleading,” or “[i]n any written statement of fact, provide material factual information that is incorrect or omit material information that is necessary to prevent any material factual statement that is made from being incorrect or misleading without a reasonable basis for believing that any such material factual statement is correct and not misleading.” 47 C.F.R. § 1.17(a) (adopted pursuant to statutory authority in sections 4(i), 4(j), 201(b), and 303(r) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. §§ 154(i) and 303(r)).

Furthermore, applicants are “responsible for the continuing accuracy and completeness of information furnished in a pending application or in Commission proceedings involving a pending application,” and must make corrections if information is not accurate and complete. 47 C.F.R. § 1.65(a) (adopted pursuant to statutory authority in sections 4(i), 303(r), and 308, 47 U.S.C. §§ 154(i), 303(r), and 308). Thus, we may rely on and enforce the correctness and continuing validity of information applicants provide in the course of our review, including voluntary commitments and other representations that applicants make in the course of our proceeding concerning their future conduct if the license-transfer or license-assignment application is approved.

Question Twelve:

It has been suggested that the FCC has played loose with the Paperwork Reduction Act in connection with its network neutrality rules. Please provide the Commission's estimate of the total paperwork burden these rules would impose on industry. Please explain when the Commission shared this estimate with Commissioners and what steps the Commission took to reduce the burden. Also, we understand that the public comment period for FCC review of the paperwork burdens associated with these rules ended on April 11, close to two months ago. Has the FCC formally submitted these information collections to OMB for its 30-day review? If not, when does it plan to do so?

Response:

The Commission initially estimated a total annual burden of 15,646 hours for the transparency rule and 239 hours for the formal complaint rules. These figures were shared with the Commissioners (and the general public) on February 9, 2011, when the Commission's information collection notices for the transparency and formal complaint rules were published in the Federal Register, though Commissioners were free to ask staff for burden estimates at any point during the 15-month-long open Internet proceeding. As discussed in the *Open Internet Order*, the costs of compliance with the adopted rules is expected to be modest, as they are generally consistent with current industry practices. Furthermore, various aspects of the rules we adopted substantially mitigate the burden on small businesses. For example, the rules require only that providers post disclosure on their websites and at the point of sale, not that they bear the cost of printing and distributing bill inserts. The impact of the rules on small businesses is discussed at length in the Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis that is appended to the *Order*.

The Commission has not yet submitted the information collections to the Office of Management and Budget. We received a number of comments on our estimated burden; Commission staff are analyzing that record and determining whether the initial burden estimates should be revisited. We will submit the information collections to OMB as soon as that process is complete.

There is growing consensus that Federal Communications Commission processes need reforming. Under both Democrat and Republican chairmen, the FCC has fallen into practices that weaken decision-making and jeopardize public confidence.  - (b) While Congress required the FCC to report annually on the status of competition in the domestic and international satellite services, there is *no specific statutory date for submission of the report to Congress*.

 - (d) The International Bureau is drafting a Report for consideration by the Commission soon. There was some delay in purchasing the necessary data so that the Commission can provide the analysis required under the statute and submit a comprehensive report.

The Enforcement Bureau has not received any formal complaints regarding Section 225(e)(2) during the Chairman’s tenure.

Three of the four cases that remain open involve complex legal, regulatory, or technical issues. One of the three is dependent on Commission action in determining state interpretation of TRS regulations. DRO is investigating ways to automate and streamline the complaints process in order to reduce the total time needed to process each complaint. The attached spreadsheet provides additional details called for by this question.

- Seventh Broadband Progress Report
 - (a) Section 706 of the Telecommunications Act of 1996, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 1302(b).
 - (b) Requires that the Commission conduct an annual inquiry concerning the availability of broadband to all Americans; the most recent report was due February 2, 2011.
 - (c), (d) The most recent due date for completion of this inquiry was February 2, 2011. On December 14, 2010, Chairman Genachowski delivered a letter to the Chairman and Ranking Member of the House Committee on Energy and Commerce and the Chairman and Ranking Member of the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science and Technology requesting an extension for the delivery of the *Seventh Broadband Deployment Report* from February 2, 2011 to April 30, 2011. The Chairman received no formal response to his request. As the Chairman explained in his request, the requested extension allowed the Commission to rely upon and analyze the nation’s most comprehensive broadband deployment data that was gathered by the Department of Commerce’s National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) for use in the national broadband map, which was made publicly available on February 17, 2011. The requested extension also enabled the Commission to rely upon more recent broadband subscribership data the Commission collects than otherwise would have been possible. The Commission adopted and released the *Seventh Broadband Progress Report* on May 20, 2011. In addition, the 2010 *Sixth Broadband Progress Report*, conducted pursuant to section 706, was due to be completed on February 3, 2010, and was adopted on July 16, 2010 and released on July 20, 2010. This 2009-2010 inquiry was conducted in conjunction with the National Broadband Plan proceeding in order to take advantage of the Commission’s parallel effort to understand the state of broadband deployment for the development of the Plan. On January 7, 2010, Chairman Genachowski sent the leadership of the House & Senate Commerce Committees a letter requesting a one month extension of the submission of the National Broadband Plan. The National Broadband Plan was delivered to Congress on March 16, 2010.

- Fees from Supplementary Services
 - (a) 47 U.S.C. § 336(e)(4)

The Commission thereafter will prepare the 14th Video Competition Report, covering 2007-2010.

- Video Competition Report

- Petitions for Reconsideration of Authorizations Granted Without a Hearing
 - (a) 47 U.S.C. § 405(a)
 - (b) Requires the Commission or Bureau, acting on delegated authority, to grant or deny, within 90 days of its filing, any petition for reconsideration that relates to an instrument of authorization (such as a license renewal or transfer of control application) granted without a hearing. (This requirement also appears in 47 C.F.R. § 1.106(j).)

- (c) During the Chairman's tenure, the Commission has acted on 744 petitions for reconsideration subject to this provision within the statutory deadline, and it has acted on 381 outside of the deadline. (The Chairman was confirmed by the Senate on June 29, 2009. Following the convention of Question No. 7, which calls for data as of July 1, 2009, the information provided here is based on data as of July 1, 2009.) The Media Bureau receives over 16,000 applications yearly from the 30,000 broadcast licensees. Some of the petitions for reconsideration involve multiple broadcast licenses, but the Bureau's tracking system counts each license separately for purposes of determining whether action was outside the statutory deadline or is overdue. Thus, the actual number of petitions for reconsideration that were acted on beyond the deadline or that are pending beyond the deadline is lower than reported. In addition, the Bureau handles major assignment and transfer of control transactions involving multiple licenses for cable and satellite service, which typically present complex factual, legal, and policy issues. In light of the Commission's limited resources to handle the large number of petitions, Bureaus may prioritize initial decisions over other filings, resulting in some missed statutory deadlines for reconsideration petitions. Sometimes ongoing litigation or investigations relating to a petition contribute to delay, as the outcome of these matters may affect the ultimate disposition of a petition. Notably, the deadlines for many of the petitions for reconsideration expired before July 1, 2009. Since July 1, 2009, the Commission has resolved over 40 percent of (169 out of 400) petitions handled by the Media and Wireless Telecommunications Bureaus that were overdue and pending before that date. Finally, the Commission has recently taken steps to speed the resolution of pending matters. Effective June 1, 2011, the Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau was authorized to terminate dormant proceedings (47 C.F.R. § 0.141). CGB has already issued a public notice seeking comment on the termination of 1000 proceedings on this basis (DA 11-992, CG Docket No. 11-99, released June 3, 2011). In addition, the Commission recently revised section 1.106 of its rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.106, effective June 1, 2011, to allow staff to dismiss petitions for reconsideration that plainly do not warrant Commission action. The attached spreadsheets provide the dates called for by this subpart.
- (d) Action outside of the deadline is pending in 630 matters. One of the pending petitions for reconsideration is being handled by the Wireline Competition Bureau (Joint Petition for Reconsideration or Clarification by New Jersey Division of Rate Counsel and the National Association of State Utility Consumer Advocates, WC Docket No. 08-238 (filed July 27, 2009) (seeking modification of certain voluntary conditions of the Commission's approval of the transfer of control of certain wireless licenses and domestic and international section 214 authorizations from Embarq and CenturyTel to a reorganized CenturyTel)). It was filed on July 27, 2009, and action was due on October 25, 2009. Due to a clerical error, this petition was not tracked as a petition for reconsideration requiring a decision within 90 days. We expect to

act on this matter within 90 days. The attached spreadsheets provide the pertinent details for other pending matters.

- Market Modification Proceedings

- Advanced Blocking Technologies and Existing Parental Empowerment Tools

- Buy American Act Report
 - (a) 41 U.S.C. § 8302(b)(1).
 - (b) The annual Buy American Act Report is required to be filed not later than 180 days after the end of the fiscal year. The report is required through Fiscal Year 2011.
 - (c), (d) The FCC's FY 2009 Buy American Act Report was due to Congress by March 30, 2010 and was sent to Congress on April 16, 2010. The FCC's FY 2010 Buy American Act Report was also due by March 30, 2011 and was sent on March 31, 2011. - Freedom of Information Act Requests


